## April

In April, we went to a small town called Palenque with missionary friends from San Francisco. They brought a team which included a dentist, doctor, nurse, chiropractor, and people for evangelism and activities for children.

Kjell did a teacher training at Discovery School in Tegucigalpa and another at Jardin y Escuela Casa de Paz (House of Peace Kindergarten and School).

## May

May marked the end of the final championship soccer (futbol) game for the New Generation Soccer League. It was

Kjell's team, Real Zambrano (Royal Zambrano), against Eligidos I (The Chosen 1 [there were two teams made from one large one called Eligidos, so one was Eligidos I and Eligidos II]). Someone from the United States donated money for one trophy for each team (1st and 2nd place) as well as medallions for each player on the 1st place team. There also was money given out (100L which is \$5) for most goals scored, most blocked goals by the goalie, plus for the 1st and 2nd and 3rd place teams to have a victory dinner.

Our children decorated t-shirts with permanent marker and highlighter that read, 'Real Zambrano' in bright yellow and the crown on the top was in bright orange.

They were the 'cheerleaders,' but there was not much cheering going on -

more like screaming! Unfortunately, Real Zambrano did not place first. Eligidos dominated the entire game (those young guns). The final score was 3-2. However, Kjell was the goalie who won 'most goals blocked!'

That night, the victory dinner (for 2nd place) was Chinese food! We met up at the classrooms at Luis'. Marcy made some Butterscotch Brownies and we had a good time.

In April, Marcy was asked to teach at a Rehabilitation Center (drug and alcohol rehab) that is located right down the street one afternoon. After that, she was asked to teach every Wednesday afternoon for two hours. There is always a translator and it is a good opportunity to not only teach the word of God, but also prepare hands-on activities in both English and Spanish.

May also marked our first earthquake at 7.1 on the Richter Scale. We felt something, but did not know what it was until the morning. There was some damage in the country (bridges, homes, roads, etc.), but nothing major near us. We are also grateful that there was no tsunami.

June was a busy month. First, Kjell did two teacher trainings. One at Casa de Luz and one at Enlaces Bilingual School.

Second, a short term missionary, Taylor, was here and did a dance class for the girls for a month and cooked meals for some families.

Third, Marcy was asked to minister in San Francisco at a cell group and church one weekend.

Fourth, English classes ended and in July another 3 month session will begin. Marcy will teach two level 1 classes and Kjell will continue with a Level 3 class.

Last, the teams began to come! The first team from Mississippi showed 'Fireproof' one night and then we watched a major Honduras vs. USA soccer

game. There was a special service for women and for couples.

The second team from Mississippi did a variety of activities: from construction (two new roofs on homes), to VBS (in Zambrano and in the mountains), to special meetings (women's and general), to medical care, to a movie night, and soccer in the afternoons.

Marcy did a 5 session 'Run the Race' seminar or devotion with the team too. A friend from CT, Dennis, also joined the team.

## News

Discovery School in Tegucigalpa (<http://www.discoveryschool.edu.hn/>) called Kjell and asked him if he would be interested in a teaching position - high school language arts. He went for the interview and was offered the position that same day.

Teaching fits exactly what Kjell is called to do (help others answer the call of God through the word of God and through education). This is an international school and has kids from all over the world—what an impact! Kjell can still help in Zambrano with missions teams, teaching english classes, ministry on Saturdays, soccer league, basketball, etc. He can even still do professional development.

## Political News

- \* The Honduran president, Manuel Zelaya, desired to change the constitution and to stay in power indefinitely.
- \* The military removed and exiled him to Costa Rica because the police would not. It was not a coup.
- \* This was a move to protect the Honduran constitution backed by all governmental branches and other organizations.
- \* The Honduran Law states that in the absence of the president, the vice president is next in command. However, the vice president resigned last year to run for president. The next in line, according to the law, is the head of Congress.
