On New Year's Eve, we went to a neighboring ministry to practice praise and worship for a service that night. Jeremiah was attacked by a dog (Japanese Akita). The dog bit him over the shoulder and knocked him down. When he got back up, it bit behind his ear and head. A staff member opened the dog's mouth and probably saved Jeremiah's life. We prayed and took him to a private hospital. After two days at the hospital, we returned home. We praise God for protecting his life and for bringing a plastic surgeon to sew him up and check him at follow up visits.

February

In February our English Classes began again. Just a way to keep ourselves in the community, meeting new people, building relationships, and practicing our Spanish.

Kjell has level 4 on Sunday nights and I have a Monday and Tuesday night class (level 1 and 2). I have been working out the curriculum for level 2 as I go, whereas level 1 I am adding activities.

I have been asked to start a Saturday afternoon class for kids

and asked to go to a neighborhood on the weekends or weekday for some teenagers, but I can't add more classes at this time. I am looking at maybe offering these in the fall.

Kjell taught teachers again at the Annual Teachers Teaching Teachers Conference in San Pedro Sula. This year, he went with other colleagues from Discovery School and they went back and forth from a hotel to a local school that hosted the conference. His sessions were great, he received great reviews, and he was able to get to know co-workers better and practice his Spanish.

A team was here from Alabama from different churches. Their emphasis was ministry (services) as well as food give away (whether in bags or cooking food). We

In La Providencia, Don Goyo was turning 68. We almost could not fit all his family members in a picture. Luis shared and then asked me to share a few words. I started in Spanish and then ran out of words.

In Las Botijas, Kjell and Luis ministered to the teens and I shared a little bit with the adults on Psalm 139 (all in Spanish). I wished I could say a whole lot more, but Henry helped explain what I was trying to say.

Kjell survived some soccer injuries as well. First, he tore a ligament on his left pinky. Then, he dislocated the thumb

on his right hand. The cast will come off in early April!

- Children or youth ministry (at New Generation Coliseo in Zambrano, in the mountains, nearby baby and children's home).
 - Adult ministry (Zambrano, in the mountains, Rehabilitation Center). This could be services, seminars, one day/night or multiple days/nights (ladies, men, couples, singles, all, leadership).
 - Feeding (purchase, bag, and give away food and/or cooking at a location).
 - Skills Classes (English intensive, cooking, sewing, woodworking, leather, etc.) (purchase of materials and/or tools may be necessary).
 - Sports clinics (soccer, basketball). From children to adults, they like to play, however they do not necessarily have the skills or know how to practice and improve their game. Dance (for children or youth).
 - Brigades (medical, dental, health classes, exercise, etc.)
 - Construction (various projects in Zambrano, in the mountains, and possibly at a daycare in Tegucigalpa).
