Highlights

In October, before I (Marcy) was finished substitute teaching at Nashville school, each grade was working on a booth for the upcoming *C a t r a c h a* Fair. I was able to go back and visit with my 7th and 8th grade students while learning about the different departments in Honduras.

At about the same time, Kjell was having auditions and beginning rehearsals for an upcoming one act play (first ever at Discovery School). This involved building a new stage (fixing the cement parts as well as making movable wooden stage extensions), full with curtains and lights.

In November two brigades came up. Kjell and Mikayla translated at a medical brigade in Zambrano. Discovery School sends students to translate for a week in a program with Cape Cares medical and dental teams. I went as a chaperone to Los Encinitos with two kids from Discovery School (Katarina being one of the students and her friend, Kaya).

I worked in registration which involved taking names, searching for patient names and numbers in the computer, looking for folders (patient charts), filling out a dental or medical card, calling and bringing patients to the 'waiting' room/area. When I had down time, I tried to organize by creating procedure documents

and most common names and towns list (with pronunciations).

Katarina translated for the pediatrician all week. She had to cram study for some medical/dental terms in Spanish and then learned a lot about medical terminology and medicine during the week too.

Los Encinitos is in the middle of the mountains and some people walked for hours to get there. There were no hot showers and we killed many spiders and crickets. Every morning, I opened the office door to let the bats fly out (once they saw the light) and the last night I was awake listening to a rat munch on Kaya's snacks that she did not zip up.

It was amazing to meet professionals (doctors, dentists, nurses) who would volunteer their time to serve. Many have been

coming for years (7-20 years). They are not affiliated with any church. They just come and serve.

We had lots of fun too. We had a tournament night (golf and darts), shopping day in the Valley, and nice, dress-up, dinner out on the last night.

The girls found out that the Discovery School Choir was invited to the Golden Gate International and Youth Choral Festival for the summer of 2012. There was a \$350 registration fee for each student and part of it due by the end of November. Praise God an anonymous donor gave the full \$700 for the registration fee. They will stay with a host family while in CA, but we are still looking for sponsors for their flights from CT to CA (approx. \$500-600 each).

There will be fundraisers during the year for performance attire and other things they need. Katarina will work on a solo with one of the choir directors in the Spring. The school has received recognition within the country and been on TV many times. This is great publicity for the school as well as opportunity to announce the festival.

Kat and Mik were also part of a battle of the bands with their youth group. They sang 'Awake and Alive' by Skillet. It's amazing how God provides them opportunities to perform.

In December the kids sang

in Songfest at school and then the Christmas break began.

Katarina, Mikayla, and I volunteered to serve Christmas dinners in two prisons (to gang members) with another ministry.

A different day, our whole family helped bag beans and sort supplies at one ministry.

We had some fun too, spending time with friends and the kids having play dates. We also had some missionaries, that could not fly home, over for a Christmas dinner.
